### Importance of excellent attendance from Ms Phillips, Head of English

Data (from the Department for Education) shows us that students who didn't achieve a grade 4 or above in English missed 10 more days on average than those who achieved a grade 5 in English. We want every student to have the time and guidance to develop the skills which will allow them to fulfil their potential.
