## Cycleway 23 construction begins on 13 March

I am writing to let you know that we will begin constructing the Lea Bridge roundabout section of Cycleway 23 on Monday 13 March 2023. This scheme is part of our ongoing Healthy Streets programme to provide more space for walking and cycling in London.

The new cycleway will allow segregated cycling along Lea Bridge Road, Lea Bridge roundabout and Kenninghall Road. The signals at Lea Bridge roundabout will be upgraded, and the signalised pedestrian crossing on Lea Bridge Road will be upgraded. The bus lane on Lea Bridge Road will be extended through the roundabout to connect with Lower Clapton Road ensuring that buses can move through the area as efficiently as possible.

## How our works may affect you

The following temporary changes will be made to help complete this work quickly and with as little disruption as possible. The roundabout will remain open throughout our work, but your journey may take longer than usual, so please plan ahead. The most impactful phases have been planned to coincide with the Easter and Summer school holidays:

Site welfare facilities will be located within suspended bays and a partly suspended footway on Cornthwaite Road close to the junction with Lea Bridge Road. Pedestrian and emergency service access will be maintained at all times.

It is likely that overnight road closures will be needed for resurfacing towards the end of the construction phase. We will provide further information regarding these nearer the time.

### **Walking routes and Bus journeys**

No changes to bus services are planned. Temporary bus stops will be used where possible when a bus stop is suspended. Please visit [tfl.gov.uk/bus/status](http://tfl.gov.uk/bus/status) for live updates.

Pavements and pedestrian crossings will remain open wherever possible. Any temporary closures or diversions will be signed, and pedestrian access will not be affected.
